Unless action is taken our threatened species are in danger of extinction. These six steps are the reforms that we urgently need:



Creation of robust **national environmental standards enshrined in law** 

An independent Environment Assurance Commission to audit performance and ensure environmental standards are being adhered to





Community access to justice and participation in environmental decision making

Recognition and respect for **Indigenous knowledge, customs** and interests under national environmental laws

Implementation of an **effective threat abatement system** 







Strong recovery plans and the resources to implement them for all our threatened species
